An Ordinance
Further to amend the Pensions Ordinance. Title.

[22nd December, 1955.] Date of commencement.

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Colony of the Falkland
Islands, as follows :— Enacting clause.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Pensions (Amend-
ment) Ordinance, 1955, and shall be read as one with the Pensions
Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance. Short title.
Cap. 49.

2. Subsection (1) of section 3 of the principal Ordinance is
amended by the addition thereto of the following paragraph :— Amendment of
section 3 of the
principal Ordinance.

“Any pension or gratuity granted under this Ordinance
shall be computed in accordance with the provisions in force at
the actual date of an officer's retirement”.

3. Section 6 of the principal Ordinance is amended as
follows :— Amendment of
section 6 of the
principal Ordinance.

(a) by deleting paragraph (vi) and substituting the following
paragraph :—

“(vi) in the case of termination of employment in the
public interest as provided by this Ordinance;”

(b) by deleting subsection (2).

Replacement of
section 7 of the
principal Ordinance.

4. Section 7 of the principal Ordinance is repealed and replaced as follows :-

“Retirement
in the public
interest.

7. Where an officer's service is terminated on the ground that, having regard to the conditions of the public service, the usefulness of the officer thereto and all the other circumstances of the case, such termination is desirable in the public interest, and a pension, gratuity or other allowance cannot otherwise be granted to him under the provisions of this Ordinance, the Governor in Council may, if he thinks fit, grant such pension, gratuity or other allowance as he thinks just and proper, not exceeding in amount that for which the officer would be eligible if he retired from the public service in the circumstances described in paragraph (v) of the preceding section”.

This printed impression has been carefully compared by me with the Bill which has passed the Legislative Council, and is found by me to be a true and correctly printed copy of the said Bill.
